We engage in ministry; we take action through advocacy; we promote healing and wholeness, and we support one another in our callings.







Book Corner

Drops Like Stars by Rob Bell We plot. We plan. We assume things are going to go a certain way. And when they don't, we find ourselves in a new place---a place we haven't been before, a place we never would have imagined on our own. It is the difficult and the unexpected, and maybe even the tragic, that opens us up and frees us to see things in new ways. Many of the most significant moments in our lives come not because it all went right but because it all fell apart. Suffering does that. It hurts, but it also creates. This book is an exploration of the complex relationship between suffering and creativity, driven by the belief that there is art in the agony.

In Good Time: 8 Habits for Reimagining Productivity, Resisting Hurry, and Practicing Peace by Jen Pollock Michel Whether we're trying to find time, save it, manage it, or make the most of it, one word defines our relationship with the clock: anxiety. Yet is productivity really the only grid for the good life? Have you ever imagined a life without hurry, relentless work, multitasking, or scarcity? A life that is characterized instead by presence, attention, rest, rootedness, fruitfulness, and generosity? This is the kind of life we are meant for, says Jen Pollock Michel. But if we want to experience freedom from time anxiety, we have to reimagine our relationship with time itself. In the pages of In Good Time, she invites you to disentangle your priorities from our modern assumptions and instead ground them in God's time. Then she shows you how to establish 8 life-giving habits that will release you from the false religion of productivity so you can develop a grounded, healthy, life-giving relationship with the clock.

Surprising Facts About Lent:

Lent is often known as an event that lasts 40 days and 40 nights, it's technically 46 days in total. Why? Because Sundays aren't considered fasting days, but rather regarded as "mini-Easters."

The word "Lent" derives from the Old English word "lenten," which simply means "spring season." It also might derive from the same root as "long," a reference to the lengthening days of the season. Furthermore, it wasn't until the 11th century that the word was embraced by the Church.

During some Ash Wednesday services, the minister will use ashes from palms that were blessed on the previous year's Palm Sunday to draw a cross on wor-

shipers' heads. Although historically in Jewish-Christian scripture, ashes symbolize mortality and repentance, here their meaning has evolved somewhat to include the idea of purification.

Abstaining from meat during on Ash Wednesday and Lenten Fridays is a penitential practice, although it has evolved over time from not eating meat from any warm-blooded animal to simply not eating meat. The interpretation of cold-blooded animals has led to some interesting exceptions to the definition of "meat" including puffin, alligator, and beaver.
