

Dear friends, This week we woke to the news that two powerful earthquakes had hit Turkey and significantly impacted neighboring Syria. The first was a magnitude 7.8 earthquake in south central Turkey, followed hours later by a magnitude 7.5 quake in the southeastern part of the country. The two quakes have devastated Turkey and Syria, collapsing thousands of buildings and damaging infrastructure. Over 2,000 people have been killed and thousands more have been injured, yet search-and-rescue efforts are only in the early stages. A cold and snowy weather system now moving through the region complicates the response efforts.


Lutheran Disaster Response and its partners are prepared to accompany our neighbors impacted by these earthquakes. One hundred percent of your gifts to "Middle East Crisis" go to supporting earthquake survivors and other people affected by disasters in the region.

Lutheran Disaster Response has been active in this region for several years, partnering with ACT Alliance, the Lutheran World Federation and the Middle East Council of Churches to accompany Syrian refugees and internally displaced people with food, water, shelter, health services and sanitation support. The epicenter of one earthquake lies near Turkish provinces that host hundreds of thousands of Syrian refugees, which will only exacerbate the refugee crisis in the region.

Lutheran Disaster Response is committed to supporting ACT Alliance and other partners in responding to these earthquakes. Even as the sun was rising on the first earthquake, ACT Alliance member organizations began distributing emergency supplies, including medicines, bedding and other relief items. A comprehensive response will be coordinated as the full extent of the impact becomes clearer.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Greetings from Frankfurt am Main! As you may know, Frankfurt is celebrating the 175th anniversary of the historic St. Pauls's Church Assembly this year, which recalls the beginning of democracy in Germany! Many activities are being planned to commemorate the groundbreaking democratic movement of 1848/49! http://www.frankfurt-tourismus.de/en/Discover-Experience/Art-and-Culture/Democracy Through the years, I have discovered that a number of St. Paul's Churches in the U.S. - particularly those founded by German immigrants during the middle of the 19th century - were named after the "mother church" in Frankfurt. Our own "St. Paulsgemeinde" in Frankfurt am Main would be most interested in learning whether there might be a direct connection betwe<mark>en "our" St. Paul's Ch</mark>urch here in Frankfurt and your St. Paul's Church on the other side of the Atlantic. As you may know, the democratic movement in this part of God's world led countless people to leave Old Germany in search of greater freedom and opportunity. Many of these people, who were referred to as the "Forty-Eighters", came to the United States to begin a new life; some of them started new churches along the way. Though badly damaged in World War II, the St. Paul's Church in Frankfurt was rebuilt after the war and is used today for special civic and cultural events, and as a memorial to the history of German democracy. Our own congregation - still called the St. Paulsgemeinde - has been at home in the neighboring "Alte Nikolaikirche am Römerberg" since 1949 (http:// www.paulsgemeinde.de). During the past years, we have discovered other churches, e.g. the St. Paul's Church (UCC) in Belleville, Illinois, which trace their historic roots directly to the "Paulskirche" in Frankfurt. Perhaps your church is among them? Should you have more detailed information re: the beginnings of your church in connection with the Paulskirche/Frankfurt, we would be most interested in learning more about this shared history.
